Be part of extending the Stockholm Metro!

Over the next few years the Stockholm Metro will be extended by almost 20 kilometres of track and 10 new stations will be built. This is the largest investment in the Metro since the 1970s.

Stockholm is one of Europe's fastest growing metropolitan regions, with an annual population increase of 35,000–40,000. This means that public transport must function well and that more homes need to be built.

A joint initiative for everyone in Stockholm


The government, Stockholm County Council and the municipalities involved have jointly agreed to finance the extension of the Metro. The agreement amounts to SEK 28.6 billion.

Stockholm County Council's Extended Metro Administration is responsible for planning and developing the Metro.

Four projects

The expansion of the Stockholm Metro is divided into four projects:

- Metro to Barkarby in Järfälla municipality
- Metro to Arenastaden in Solna municipality
- Metro to Nacka and Söderort i Stockholm
- Depot and rolling stock



Procurement of contracts

Contract procurement is scheduled to begin in 2017. Read more about the procurement procedure on the next page.

Construction period

Preliminary contracts will be completed during 2017 and 2018 and construction of all the projects is sche-duled to begin during 2018–2019. However, the necessary permits need to be in place for this to happen. The construction work is expected to take around 6 years for the lines to Barkarby and Arenastaden and 7–8 years for the line to Nacka and Söderort.


Qualification of suppliers

We use the TransQ pre-qualification system managed by Achilles System AS to qualify suppliers.

Qualification involves an assessment of the suppliers technical capabilities and capacity and their financial standing. It is the suppliers qualified through TransQ who will receive an invitation to tender. You can read more about how to register your company in the system at achilles.com.
